The Canada Day festivities are just one day away! This year's celebrations will begin with a pancake breakfast at 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM at the Community Centre. It will be followed by the annual parade starting at the Community School at 11:00 AM, once completed Broad Street from Hill Avenue to Battle Avenue will be blocked off for Lunch on Main Street at 11:30 AM. After lunch there will be a singing of O' Canada at the Tomahawk Park at 12:30. Once concluded, the activities at the Park will begin with Bingo from 12:30 PM - 2:30 PM with Local Live Music starting at 2:30 PM and the Bouncy Castles, Face Painting, Volleyball / Gaga Ball and a Dunk Tank will all be set up from 12:30 PM - 4:00 PM. There will also be a Quilt Walk, Vendors and much more at the Tomahawk Park.

The Cut Knife Bowling Alley will be open from 2:30 PM - 4:30 PM offering \$3.00 per game. The Spare Room Art Gallery will also be open from 2:30 PM - 5:30 PM. The Elks Theatre will be showing the new Lilo & Stitch movie for free at 4:00 PM. Beginning at 5:30 PM on Broad Street the RCMP will be offering free Pulled Pork Sandwiches followed by a dessert of a Canada Day cake at 6:30 PM. From 5:30 PM – 9:30 PM there will be a Beer Gardens set up along with Digital Keys DJ's who will be playing dance music on main street. Be sure to watch the Bed Races and afterwards we will have everyone move to the Tomahawk Park to cap off the night with a fireworks display.

The Town would like to thank the Canada Day Committee for organizing all of the activities and events. We would also like to Thank all of the volunteers who took time to help as well as a big Thank You to everyone who donated to the Fireworks, Bouncy Castles, and Face Painting. A huge Thank You to the RCMP for the pulled pork supper. It is really great to hear and see all of the excitement leading up to this year's Canada Day celebration.

A quick friendly reminder that all property owners are responsible for cutting their grass and weeds right up to the back alley, this would include any area behind fences. Additionally, all pet dogs and cats are required to be on a leash wearing a tag. These pet tags must be registered and purchased at the Town Office for \$25.00 with any replacement tags costing \$10.00.
